In the early 2000s, CBS produced a television show called Joan of Arcadia. Lasting two seasons, the show depicted a teenager, Joan (played by Amber Tamblyn), who regularly encountered God. God would often show up as different people and converse with Joan, giving her "missions" to complete that helped people in her neighborhood or school. In the first episode, Joan, doubting that she is actually talking to God (this time, being portrayed by a teenaged boy), asks God to show her a miracle. God points to a tree, which causes Joan to say sarcastically, "It's a tree." God replies, "Let's see you make one!"

what we see or experience in our lives are things we often consider to be ordinary. We often take ordinary things for granted. Nature is one of these things, but so are family, friendships, and other relationships with people, pets, coworkers, or fellow church-goers. Let us remember, however, that God is able to take "ordinary" things in our lives and make them extraordinary! Like Joan with the tree, we sometimes fail to see the extraordinary in the people we know and in our surroundings.

"ordinary" month of August, I invite you to consider how God has made the ordinary time and events in your life extraordinary and perhaps even holy. Let us seek to recognize God all around us and in our relationships with others. Let us be thankful to God for the transformation of the ordinary into the extraordinary!

- -Soaps


We need volunteers to join an outreach team led by Magothy members to spend 2 – 4 hours per month in this endeavor.



Trustees

The Trustees have completed the following projects recently:

- 1. Outside fellowship hall electrical work was done to re-wire electric outlet to operate a sewage pump. Cost \$1250.00
- 2. Replaced a sewage pump that was not working Cost \$1350.00
- 3. Scheduled maintenance was performed on all three air-conditioners in the fellowship hall, white chapel, and parsonage. Changed thermostat settings in fellowship hall to coordinate with occupancy times. Total cost: \$900
- 4. Outside clean-up and mulch in flower bed was done by Boy Scouts and church members.
 Mulch donated by church member.
- 5. Copier in church office was returned to leasing company. Cost savings to the church now as there will be no lease payments and maintenance fees. Still a copier in the library.

Future projects for the Trustees:

1 Replace chapel church concrete ramp with new concrete or metal ramp. Base of existing ramp is falling apart and beyond repair / patching.

- 2. Repair kitchen back door as hard to open.
- 3. Remove plexi-glass on chapel stain glass exterior that yellowed and replace with new material. There are 20 stain glass windows, and some need individual glass needs to be replaced. May require a fund-raising plan and / or the need to find grant funds.
- 4. Install a monitoring device on the co-op nursery school electrical panel to determine the electric usage.
