Welcome to the season of Lent!
Lent comes from the Old English word lencten, means
lengthening of the daylight hours, which is what occurs in spring. Lent, in its traditional Christian sense, is an annual season of fasting and penitence in preparation of Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday and lasting 40 days (not counting Sundays) to Easter Sunday. It is a time when we attempt to be honest with

ourselves and with God about

our sins.

The season of Lent invites us to meditate on our mortality, sinfulness, and need for a savior; it invites us to renew our commitment to daily repentance. It invites us into a forty-day period of self-denial, a time to focus on one or more practices of imposed self-discipline so that we can remind ourselves of the depth of our sinfulness and the frequency of our failings in our journey with God.

The forty days of Lent are meant to recall for us Jesus' forty days

of temptation by Satan in the desert. How we enter into the disciplines of the season affects how much we grow over the 40 days. Christians are forever trying to place ourselves...all that we are...in God's hands at all times. That's a hard thing, a seemingly impossible thing, and sometimes a scary thing.

We need to remember that we enter the season as Easter people. We are called to remember with confidence and gratitude that Christ has already conquered sin and death. In that remembrance, we should be motivated by faith and drawn by trust – trust that He has given us repentance as a grace – a personal gift of God to us that comes for the purpose of instilling life in us. God loves us so much that God gave us his Son to bring God's redemptive love to us: we are called

Both Bible Study groups invite new members.




NOTE: If you'd like to attend the evening group but have difficulty driving at night, let us know and we'll work on carpool arrangements.

to remember that "... God sent His only begotten Son so that all who believe in Him might not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him" [John 3:16 – 17]. We who journey the Lenten wilderness are called to remember God's faithfulness and extraordinary love as we make our way towards the Easter celebration. And I believe our Lenten practice should be out of response to this unfathomable love – not out of guilt, not out of obedience to rituals, but out of the overwhelming gratefulness for God's love on our behalf.

I encourage you to be attentive to God's Spirit – is God drawing your attention toward an attitude or specific quality that



God desires to purge or to enlarge in you? Or is God perhaps forming in you a vision or picture of your journey in faith, a gift of hope to encourage you? Ask God to reveal the ways that you might be fuller of God's grace and love than you could have ever imagined. May our forty days produce a God-given strength within us that we never knew could be possible!

# Winter Relief is Coming to Magothy March 18-25!

Our Winter Relief or week is Monday, March 18 through Monday, March 25, **2024.** As many of you know, Magothy UMC has hosted people who don't have permanent housing for a full week once per year for well over a decade (except for 2021 when the program was cancelled due to COVID). The program is organized and administered by the Arundel House of Hope, a non-profit organization located in Glen Burnie. Approximately 40 churches are participating in the program this season.

Generally, we host about 30 clients, but this year it will probably be 15 or less due to success in finding permanent housing and the milder winter weather.

WHAT WE WILL NEED:

Chaperones – We need at least 2 chaperones for each shift. The evening shifts are 7:00 pm to midnight. The overnight shifts are midnight to 6:00 am. On weekends we need chaperones during the day, split into 3-hour shifts for morning, mid-day, and afternoon. (Monday through Friday, clients are transported to the Arundel House of Hope facility during the day.)

#### Food and Meal Providers -

We serve hot breakfast and dinner on-site each day. On weekends, we serve lunch on-site. Typically, small groups of volunteers will prepare, serve, and in many cases, provide the food. On weekdays, bagged lunches are provided to the clients as they leave each morning. Thus, we need volunteers to make and bag the lunches each night before.

Donations of packaged snacks, bottled/canned drinks, are encouraged.

Funding – Typically, this ministry costs about \$1,500 each year. This includes food, supplies, transportation, laundry, Dish TV service, and any unanticipated costs. (We get some food from the foodbank and volunteers, but typically only about half the total need.)

We carried over \$800 extra funds from 2023, but for the balance could use small monetary donations above your normal giving, designated for Winter Relief. Donations may be placed in the offering plate, in envelopes marked "For Winter Relief" or sent to the church office.

Please pray about how God is calling you to serve this year.

## An Update from Magothy's Finance Committee

Many thanks to our gracious church family for your ongoing financial support of Magothy UMC and her ministries.

The Mission of MUMC is to Share Christ's Love, Hear the Word of God, and Serve People. We accomplish this mission statement every time we open our doors for the recovery groups, the monthly breakfast, Doorstep Mission, youth activities, and so much more. Thanks to your generous donations to our Manna fund, we also help individuals from our church family and community with financial assistance to avoid eviction, pay utility bills and meet other urgent needs. What a blessing to know that people are comfortable coming to Magothy to get help and experience God's love.

Like most churches, we're not yet back to the levels of engagement we had before 2020. We have seen church attendance and giving both rebounding since the Pandemic, though a bit slower than we'd hoped. You'll recall that we told vou back in late 2022 that our usual "reserve" fund levels were running lower than usual. The \$27,000 raised through the Niftee Thriftee "matching money" fundraiser, and other generous year-end gifts that year restored that reserve.

We closed 2022 in good financial shape. By careful spending, conducting a pledge drive, and drawing some funds from that 2022 reserve in 2023, we were able to carry out all of our missions and ministry, and again met all our obligations, including paying 100% of our mission shares! This is quite an accomplishment for any church.

As we move into 2024, the Finance Committee will keep you posted on the state of our finances. The monthly Finance Committee meetings are held on the first Sunday of each month at noon in the library (unless otherwise calendared), and all are welcome.

# Magothy Trustees Want You to Know ...

## Trustees for Magothy UMC:

The Trustees named above are very active in maintaining the three buildings and large property. This group meets monthly. Pastor Brooks, Felicia Granofsky (Treasurer) and Lee Catlett (Administrator) also usually attend our meetings.

The Trustees have continued to monitor and make repairs to The White Chapel, Educational Bldg/Fellowship Hall, and Harmony House plus the Chapel in the Woods. We faced many challenges last year but at the same time attempted to make some changes to save money.

### Some actions taken in 2023:

- A new copier lease was negotiated due to the previous lease expiration. With a better lease rate and less cost per page, Church will own a copier within three years. Users need to be more cognitive of what is being copied and the number of copies.
- Installed Wi-Fi thermostats in the Fellowship Hall and White Chapel. Now one can control temperature settings more and by mobile phone or PC. Should see future savings in energy costs. Just installation cost for thermostats to the church.
- The Anne Arundel County Fire Marshall did an inspection and found some deficiencies that have been corrected. This

did cost the church some money. Plus received free material and labor from others. Within one year need to install ceiling tiles in the basement below Magothy Cooperative Preschool- Approx cost \$2000 plus free labor by the Preschool.

- The Harmony House had a metal roof leak that had to be repaired plus some ceiling damage. Misc repairs were done. The escrow account helped cover some expenses.
- The Chapel in the Woods has a new shed.
- Some trees have fallen on the property.
- We continue to pay for lawn services, snow removal, pest control, HVAC maintenance, insurance, fire systems inspections and utilities. These expenses are very high and continue to increase. Bills are always being reviewed to ensure fees are fair and reasonable.

## Projects on the "to-do" list:

Some of these projects are critical needs and some are longer term. The ideal would be to combine volunteer help wherever possible, to reduce costs, with professional help, as required. Minor repairs are now often being contracted out due to members not able to do the work or no volunteers.

- 1. The Harmony House outside stairway should have Bilco cellar metal doors installed to cover the full area way down the steps to stop leaves clogging up the drain and prevent water coming in the basement. Approx cost \$4,000.
- 2. The Educational Bulding/Fellowship Hall has a fire alarm system that is very old and parts are starting to be hard to find. The system is outdated. We have very few strobe smoke detectors, which the Deaf community is very concerned about. The existing system cannot be upgraded. It is not central station

- 3. The White Chapel has no fire alarm system. Approx costs \$35,000.
- 4. The Educational Bldg/ Fellowship Hall exterior building needs painting. We have wood that needs replacing that is rotten. Approx cost \$5,000.
- 5. The Harmony House needs exterior painting for \$5,000 plus. Shutters need to be painted too. The gutters on the Educational Bldg/Fellowship Hall and White Chapel need to be cleaned out and re-secured in sections. Approx. Cost \$2,500. 6. The old shed in The Chapel in the Woods needs to be removed from the property. Approx
- 7. Leaf removal is now being contracted as the Boy Scouts did the work before.
- 8. The church's stained-glass window coverings require some repairs and replacement. Approx Cost \$45,000.
- 9. The Harmony House monthly deposit to the escrow account should be increased by about \$125/month

#### **Generated Income:**

Cost \$500.

- 1. Anne Arundel County continues to pay monthly lease payments, utilities, and water/ sewage bills for Harmony House. Lease will be increased soon.
- 2. Magothy Preschool continues to pay monthly lease payments. Plus assist in making repairs and cover expenses. They are a real asset to the church.
- 3. The Nifty Thrifty Shop is a real help in making donations to the church building repairs. Magothy does not pay their insurance or utilities.
- 4. Magothy Church of the Deaf assists with expenses (electric, capital improvements).
- 5. Some outside organizations or private parties do make donations from using the building. But

other groups need to contribute to cover the cost of air conditioning and heating the rooms.

## **Summary:**

The Trustees need more members to do the management of the property. Gordon and Elaine Grahe's time and talents surely will be missed.

- Keep in mind the Trustees are not here to hinder the use of building activities but want to make sure the project is planned with no unsafe or unhealthy issues.
- The church is fortunate to have a church member as the Custodian who looks out for the Trustees' interest. The Church Secretary is helpful in being on site for contractors and informing the Trustees. Working with the Church Treasurer is a pleasure for managing the expenses and reports.
- The Trustees continue to monitor all new building expenses priorities, which is most beneficial. All work will be based first on health, life safety and building code.
- The costs of Trash Removal, Pest
   Management, Fire Inspections, Building
   Insurance, Lawn Maintenance, and Electric/
   Gas have all seen increases in 2023

#### **Reminders:**

- Please reset thermostats in rooms when not be occupied to 60 degrees and reset when occupied to 71 degrees.
- Insure all interior doors and exterior doors are closed/shut all the way. Sometimes doors do not close automatically. Ensure doors are locked. Exterior doors have been found to be unlocked the next day.

If you see any unsafe conditions or issues in the building, please let a Trustee know or contact the church office.

# **Examples of Daily Practices for Lenten Season**

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the 40 days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered.
